6. Considering the Mark 8 passage, how would you paraphrase Jesus' expression in verse 34?
7. In what ways have you denied yourself in order to follow Jesus?

REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS

1. What's your own personal experience of reading the Bible; do you do so on your own, do you "save up for Sunday" and listen to it there, have you ever followed a pattern like a devotional guide, "reading the Bible in a year", or lectionary readings?
2. Most Christian churches in Canada are catholic or mainline, over 22 million of them use a lectionary, a cycle of readings through the year, which means that the whole Bible gets read within a cycle. Do you think if you or your church followed the Bible readings that the majority of Canadians follow that it would open up opportunities for talking about the scriptures together?
3. When you read the 10 commandments, which are part of the readings for this week, do you rush through them to get them over with? Are there particular ones that stand out? If some stand out, are they your issues or somebody else's?
4. All the labor saving devices and technologies in the last 30 years seems to have resulted in us working harder, being busier. What does Sabbath mean to you?

REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS
